I am so looking forward to getting outside and planting flowers and my bucket garden. I love seeing new life and growth. This is probably my favorite season!

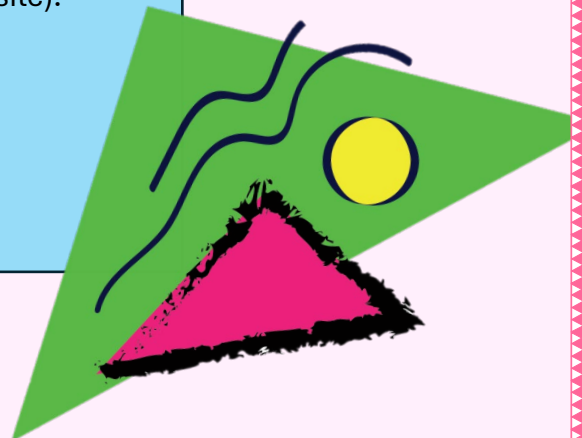

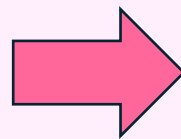
Strawberry Chocolate Greek Yogurt Bark

Ingredients

- 3 cups whole-milk plain Greek yogurt
- ¼ cup pure maple syrup or honey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 ½ cups sliced strawberries
- ¼ cup mini chocolate chips

Directions

1. Line a large rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper.
2. Stir yogurt, maple syrup (or honey) and vanilla in a medium bowl. Spread on the prepared baking sheet into a 10-by-15-inch rectangle. Scatter the strawberries on top and sprinkle with chocolate chips.
3. Freeze until very firm, at least 3 hours. To serve, cut or break into 32 pieces.



TO MAKE AHEAD- Freeze between sheets of parchment for up to 1 month

- 2 cups chicken cooked and diced – I use the canned chicken and it works well
- 1 can of cream of chicken soup
- ¾ cup Mayonnaise – I use Helman's
- 1 Tbs Lemon juice
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 Cup Celery – diced
- 2 tsp onion (optional) – I usually will use about ½ onion for a double recipe (I don't mind the onion)
- 2 cups cooked rice
- 1 can sliced water chestnuts

Mix all ingredients together in a bowl and put into a baking dish then top with a mixture of
1 cup butter cornflakes
½ cup slivered almonds
Bake at 350 degrees for 30-40 minutes. Enjoy!

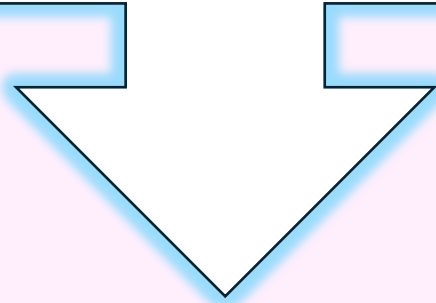

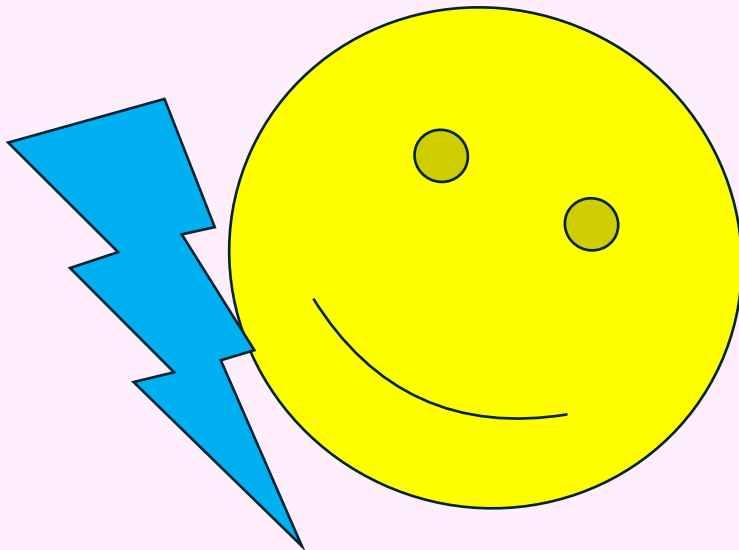

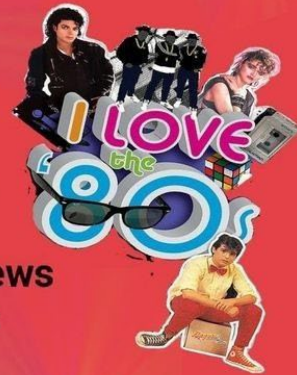
